

Centennial Heritage Museum

he Kellogg House and the man who designed and built the home will be the focus of our June 9, 2005 general meeting at the Kidseum at 7:30 p.m. Our speaker will be Adam Reed England, Site Interpreter at Centennial Heritage Museum.

The 1898 Kellogg House, the 1899 Maag House, a nature center, a blacksmith shop, a small orange grove and a picnic area make up the museum complex on four acres south of Centennial Park on Harvard Street off Fairview, see map on page 2.

The Discovery Museum (now renamed the Centennial Heritage Museum is where the Orange County Historical Society had office and archive space for several years in temporary buildings no longer there.

We lost our office on 20th Street in Santa Ana when the building in which we were located was razed as part of Bowers Museum expansion. We relocated to the Discovery Museum property in 1990. It is interesting to note that those individuals who made that move feasible are still active in the society today, Bruce Sinclair and Richard Vining, the movers. Linda Herman, was the curator who packed, unpacked and organized office and archive.

We moved to our present location in the Dr. Howe-Waffle House and Medical Museum in 1996.

The museum promotes local history through hands-on-educational programs for students and visitors of all ages. Children learn what life was like in the 1890s by playing with vintage toys, doing laundry, making butter and trying on vintage clothing.

Other tours focus on the blacksmith shop, life in the gold camps, eco-system study in the fresh water pond, plant study and compass and map reading. All these are made understandable to children with activities and crafts that engage their interest through hands-on. *Continued page 2*



THE MAAG HOUSE

If the name Maag seems familiar it should, Jorice and Joseph Maag have been long time members. Jorice has presented several programs through the years. Many will remember her talk on the Dr. Clark House part of the Fullerton Arboretum. The Maag house at Centennial Heritage Museum was the home of Joe's grandparents, John and Catherine Maag.

John Maag was born in Westphalia, Germany. Along with his mother and brother, he migrated to the U.S. In 1865 at the end of our Civil War. First settled in Michigan, moving to Nebraska, where he married Catherine Steffes in 1884, then moved his family to southern California in 1891.

He bought 31 acres of farmland in what is now Santa Ana and became an orange grower.

Over production of oranges by so many growers created a buyer's market, so farmers could not make a profit. Maag organized the oranges growers between Santa Ana and Redlands into the Santiago Orange Growers Association. As a group, they established fair prices for the oranges. Maag also helped in the creation of the Central Lemon Growers, the Olive Heights Orange Growers, and Richland Walnut Growers associations. Membership in

such organizations led to Mr. Maag's involvement in the development of Sunkist Growers.

Buying more property over time, he branched into banking, helping to organize the Citizens Commercial and Savings Bank of Santa Ana. This bank is now known as the California National Bank. He died on his ranch in 1931.

Catherine lived in the house until her death in 1955. The ranch was then purchased by the adjacent Fairhaven Cemetery. Their caretakers lived in the home until the property was sold to a mobile home park in the 1970s. In 1982 it was moved to the Discovery Museum in order to save it from demolition.



The Maag house is slowly being restored as funding allows, but it stills needs a great deal of work. When restoration is completed, it will house a regional history museum.

POSTCARD BOOK

The San Clemente Historical Society will host the Annual Meeting of the Conference of California Historical Societies to be held in San Clemente from June 23 to June 26, 2005. A highlight of the three-day affair will be a tour of historic Casa Pacifica, also known as the Western White House, with guest speaker Donald Nixon, nephew of President Richard Nixon. Other tours include the historic Forster Ranch House, Chapel and Bunkhouse Museum on Camp Pendleton, with tour guide (and descendant) Tony Forster, President of the San Juan Capistrano Historical Society.

Local residents are invited to join in any or all of the tours and festivities.

"This will be a big deal for San Clemente and our neighboring cities," said Mike Cotter, President of the San Clemente Historical Society. "We should have about 100 to 125 visitors from all over California, and about 50 to 75 local residents signing up for one or more of our historic tours and presentations."

"The Western White House tour is going to be a big draw for participants," said Richard Proctor, President of the Conference of California Historical Societies, and also a San Clemente resident.

The three-day event is co-sponsored by the Dana Point and San Juan Capistrano Historical Societies.

The Camp Pendleton tour includes lunch at Lake O'Neill. After Camp Pendleton, the tour stops by El Rancho Guajome Adobe in Vista, California, one of the oldest buildings in California.

Other tours include Mission San Juan Capistrano and the historic tall ship, the *Pilgrim*, a full size re-creation of the hide brig immortalized by Richard Henry Dana, Jr. in his American seafaring classic novel, *Two Years Before the Mast*. The *Pilgrim* is located at the Ocean Institute in Dana Point Harbor. Additionally, registrants can sign up for a tour of the Goldschmidt House, a 1928 Spanish colonial revival residence by noted architect Paul R. Williams, private home of Lee and Dena Van Slyke, and the only residence in San Clemente listed with the National Register of Historic Places.

The Ocean Institute will be the setting for a presentation by Bill Bluett, a Director of the San Clemente Historical Society, entitled, "Genealogical Research Sources." Additionally, local radio theater director and producer Casey Hayes will deliver a presentation entitled, "Lurid Story of Doheny Mansion."

On Friday evening, June 24, following a dinner at Casa Romantica, there will be a presentation by author and Orange County Historical Commissioner Doris L. Walker entitled, "How Local History Has Linked a Trio of Towns: San Clemente, San Juan Capistrano and Dana Point." Casa Romantica is San Clemente founder Ole Hanson's original 1927 Spanish colonial revival style residence which has been fully restored as a cultural center and

is listed on the National Registry of Historic Places.

On Saturday, June 25, after musical entertainment and dinner at the Presbyterian Church Fellowship Hall, Cotter will deliver a Powerpoint presentation entitled, "Stopping the Bulldozers -- The Birth of the San Clemente Historical Society."
